

Have you ever wanted to know more about bees or even fancy keeping Bees yourself then this may well be for you! Sirhowy Valley Honeybee Company has an interactive bee hive house in the school grounds of Ynysddu Primary School. The hive house is split into two sections, an interactive working area where people can work with the bee hives and a viewing area where people can sit and watch without having to wear a bee suit.

### **Bee workshop sessions will** take about 1 hour, and include: (For groups of up to 6 people)

Why bees are important ...



- About honey, how it is made and extracted ...



How to approach a bee hive, wearing a bee suit ...



About life in the hive, how the bees work and live ...



How to prevent swarming, develop new colonies ...



How to rear queen bees.

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A one hour workshop session for 6 people would cost approximately £10 per person. Workshops can only be run during March, April, May, June, July, August, September and October and are weather dependant.

Everyone attending a workshop will need to bring and wear wellies - this is for safety reasons. They will also need to wear trousers, as they will have to put a bee suit on over their clothing.

## **Bogus Street** charity collections

#### Before deciding to give charitable donations on the street or at the door:

- Ask to see their licence for Street Collections and House to House Collections from the Local Authority as they should have one.
- Check that a Landline is included in any material, not just a mobile number.
- If you are concerned you could check directly with the Charity to see if they are collecting in your area or with **Caerphilly County Borough Council** licensing department.
- Any buckets, tins etc for cash donations should be secure and tamper proof, and again show the purpose of the collection.
- If you wish to set up a Direct Debit, we suggest you don't do this on the street or on your doorstep. Simply contact the Charity directly yourself to make these arrangements.

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#### The Welsh Government introduced the Social Services and Wellbeing (Wales) Act on 6th April 2016.

Welsh Government were keen from the outset to hear the views of citizens about the new law and how it is working, so a number of Citizen's Panels have been developed. The role of the Citizen Panel is to collect, collate and pass on the views of people affected by the Act to the Welsh Government.

### What is the Panel?

The Gwent Panel was formed in July 2015 and meets every six weeks. The Panel is made up of representatives of citizen's organisations from across Gwent. Members were drawn from a wide range of groups, including Over 50 Forums, Parent's Network, People's First, the Stroke Association, Disability Wales and many more organisations. The Panel regularly invites speakers from the broad field of Social Services to address key issues, gathers citizen's views and sends representatives to the Regional Partnership Board.

The Panel rotates its meetings around Gwent to make attendance easier and is keen to attract new members. Any individual can join if they have experience of using, or working with, Health and Social Services. If you are interested in joining, contact Chris Hodson (Chair) at chrishodson3@gmail.com

# You should have rights!

**The United Nations Principles for Older Persons sets out the interests** and rights of older people but does not provide individual older people with actual rights.

Wales has also published a Declaration of Human Rights for Older People (http://gov.wales/ topics/health/publications/health/strategies/ rights/?lang=en) but that is aspirational and has no legal status. Essentially there is no single comprehensive, enforceable human rights instrument for older people in Wales.

The Commissioner for Older People in Wales is

concerned that human rights are often not seen as relevant or applicable by service providers and that the rights of too many older people are diminished as they get older.

The Commissioner has therefore committed to creating a single piece of legislation for Wales to protect older people's rights and address any gaps that are identified. Creating a rights based approach in law to public service delivery in Wales is essential to ensure that the rights of older people can no longer be overlooked or ignored. The findings of an expert group the Commissioner has set up will be presented to the Welsh Government in Autumn 2016.

# We think you should know about Housing for an ageing population

With an increasing number of older people living longer in Wales, the supply of suitable and appropriately located housing for people over 65 has become a crucial issue to address. It is an important contributory factor to health and wellbeing for older people.

The Welsh Government's Expert Panel on housing for an ageing population in Wales has consulted widely over the summer and Caerphilly County Borough 50+ Forum has provided support by "road testing" a questionnaire and by responding to the consultation.



A self-assessment form for people wondering whether or not to move home and seeking information on options has been produced with support from The Housing Corporation

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#### The main issues being addressed include:

Do we have enough of the right homes suitable for older people?

Will these homes support people to live independently for as long as possible?

#### Is moving a real choice for older people in Wales & if not, why not?

The Group will conclude its work by the end of the year. A decision about whether to move home in later life is never easy but there is practical help available.




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# SCHOOL INTERGEN CLUBS

There are currently a total of eleven term time clubs in Caerphilly borough covering a range of Primary and Secondary schools.
